Why Make A Will ?

Making a will and keeping it regularly updated makes good financial sense for your family, friends and dependents as well as giving you peace of mind.

It ensures that all your wishes are followed and allows you the opportunity to make specific gifts, known as legacies, to individuals, or to the church and favourite charities you've supported during your lifetime.

Making a Difference

For centuries generous church members have left gifts to their local churches in their wills which have helped the church in a wide variety of ways.

At St Paul's we regard Christian giving as part of our thankful response to God's generosity toward us.

Your legacy could help us to complete a project or fund a new initiative to share the love of God within our local community.

Get Professional Advice

To leave a legacy you must make a will and to do this you are advised to get independent professional advice from a solicitor.

They can advise you fully and answer questions such as it best to leave a legacy of a fixed amount or leave a percentage of your estate to a particular individual, church or charity.

St Paul's Legacy Policy

Any legacy would need to be made out to 'The P.C.C of Little Eaton' and the current policy agreed for the use of any legacy funding at St Paul's Little Eaton is as follows :

'The policy of the P.C.C. of St Paul's Little Eaton is to use legacies to help fund projects that aim to further develop Christian mission and outreach within the parish. The P.C.C. will discuss with executors the most appropriate use of the gift in the light of current projects and the donors known areas of interest in the church.'
